In a motion (Nock, Trotter passed) to approve the minutes of the July 2, 2018 and July 9, 2018meetings.

Review and approval of bills:

In a motion (Downing, Nockpassed) the bills presented to be paid. (Copy of bill list attached to original minutes).

President & CEO Ms Stacey Weisner Delmarya Discovery Center and updates:

- 1. New name and logo change from Delmarva Discovery Center to Delmarva Discovery Museum.
- 2. Thanked city of Pocomoke Public Works for flushing water lines for animal displays.
- 3. 10th anniversary museum party on Friday, July 27, 2018 5-8pm.
- 4. Coastal Style magazine readers chose museum as best museum in Worcester County again.
- 5. Awarded \$100.000.00 Capital grant from Maryland Heritage Area Authority.
- 6. Kelly Schultz, Maryland Secretary of Labor, Licensing & Regulation is coming for a Visit.
- 7. Governor Hogan invited to a Thank-You reception for help from State of MD Bond Bills and MHAA.
- 8. Will host a multi-Chamber of Commerce Business After Hours on Thursday, September 13, 2018 from 5-7 pm.

Councilman Nock and Ms. Weisner were in agreement that some place closer to the museum to obtain refreshments, food & drink would be beneficial to patrons. Children would not have to cross the street.

Sewer Line Replacement on 11th Street Update:

Eleventh street was collapsing, had sink holes and cracked asphalt. 2 service lines coming from the houses feeding to the main line had broken loose completely. Started repair on that area and finished up on Tuesday evening 12 am. Thursday morning started on 2ndsinkhole near Kurt Dennis's house. Was only one service line going into the main line. When digging out first section discovered a service line made of steel pipe going into terracotta pipe. Around where service line goes into main pipe they just poured concrete into hole instead of putting a boot to repair properly. In the 2ndsinkhole area 2 things were found; Ten years ago they ran a line to flush out pipes, line got stuck in main sewage line and just cut and tied 150' of line to steps under manhole on Market Street. After 8-10 years line just finally clogged up. Were able to pull out old line with a bobcat but had left 38' of damaged, cracked pipe that had to be replaced. Workers were out until 11 pm 2 nights and finally finished up on Saturday night at 2 or 3 am. Cost not finalized yet. Will be in \$20,000 range under street repair work. City Manager complimented and recommended to bring public works men into next town council meeting to give them a recognition and \$200.00 bonus gift cards.
